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Secretary of State Shirley N. Weber Urges Californians to Vote Early as Voter ID Battle Intensifies

California Secretary of State Shirley N. Weber is asking voters to help protect the integrity of the November 2026 election by taking one important step: Vote early.

Weber said her office is working to combat misinformation, expand voter outreach and maintain ballot security as California prepares for the Nov. 3 general election.

"We want folks to vote early because there are so many attacks on voting," Weber said. "We want to make sure everyone gets their ballot in. Don't wait until the last minute. It will help us immensely in terms of not just reducing time but making sure that your ballot gets counted."

Weber spoke Aug. 18 at the UC Student and Policy Center in Sacramento as part of its California Leaders Speaker Series. She encouraged eligible Californians to participate in the election and avoid waiting until the last minute to return their ballots.

The California Leaders Speaker Series is an ongoing program that provides a platform for public officials, policy experts and state leaders to

engage with students and the broader University of California community. According to organizers, the bipartisan series is designed to foster dialogue about significant political and social issues and strengthen connections between the university and the Capitol community.

During the discussion, Weber offered insights into her role as California's chief elections officer and the preparations underway ahead of the November election.

Former Assemblymember Catharine Baker (R-Dublin), director of the UC Student and Policy Center and a former California Fair Political Practices Commission member, moderated the conversation.

Their discussion focused on election integrity, leadership and the future of democracy. Weber described California's voting process as a "special system" that empowers people while requiring election officials to manage complex logistical, security and communications responsibilities.

"We have to be careful with this system, our voting systems," Weber said. "It empowers the

people to have their voice heard, and if you treat it right those voices will be heard and adhered to (in terms) of policy and programs."

Since the June primary, state election officials have worked to provide voters with information intended to help them participate safely, easily and confidently in the general election.

Hours after Weber spoke, U.S. Sen. Alex Padilla (D-Calif.) held a news conference about a mile away at California Democratic Party headquarters to launch a campaign opposing Proposition (Prop) 39, the voter identification measure on the November ballot.

The measure would establish additional identification and citizenship-verification requirements for California voters. Its official ballot label states that it would prohibit citizens from voting unless they present government-issued identification.

Padilla, Assembly Speaker Robert Rivas (D-Hollister), Senate President Pro Tem Monique Limón (D-Santa Barbara), Assemblymember Isaac

Gov. Newsom Nominates 3 Black Women Judges to Serve on State Courts of Appeal

Gov. Gavin Newsom nominated three Black women — Justice Rashida Adams and Judges Denise Hippach and Juliet Macaulay — to serve on the California Courts of Appeal.

Adams, Hippach, and Macaulay are among eight appellate court nominees recently announced by Newsom. The governor also appointed nine Superior Court judges across five counties.

Adams, of Los Angeles County, was nominated as presiding justice of the Second District Court of Appeal, Division Three. She has served as an associate justice on the court since 2023 and previously served as a Los Angeles County Superior Court judge from 2017 to 2023.

Adams, who earned her law degree from Yale Law School, would succeed retired Justice Lee Edmon. Her term would begin Jan. 4, 2027, subject to voter confirmation in the Nov. 3 general election.

Hippach, of San Luis Obispo County, was nominated as an associate justice of the Second District Court of Appeal, Division Six. She has served on the Santa Barbara County Superior

Court since 2022 and previously worked in county counsel, attorney general, district attorney and appellate counsel offices. She earned her law degree from the University of Southern California Gould School of Law.

Macaulay, of Orange County, was nominated as an associate justice of the Fourth District Court of Appeal, Division Three. She has served on the Orange County Superior Court since 2022.

Previously, she was chief administrative law judge at the California Department of Social Services and held several positions with the California Board of Parole Hearings. She earned her law degree from the University of Ibadan.

Newsom's other appellate nominees are David Sapp and Judge Lauri Damrell for the Third District; Judges Marsha Amin and Lisa Rodriguez for the Fourth District, Division One; and Judge Frederick Chung for the Sixth District.

The governor also appointed Justin Ford, Erin Murphy, Wilson Park and Maricela Segura to the Los Angeles County Superior Court; Timothy Mulhere in Riverside County; and Crystal Salumbides and Brigid Campo in San Diego County.

David Kim received an interim appointment in Sonoma County, and Phoebe Maffei received an interim appointment in San Francisco County.

The appellate nominations require confirmation by the Commission on Judicial Appointments. Each appellate position pays \$280,052 annually, while the Superior Court positions pay \$244,727.

Big City Mayors Ask for "Yes" Vote on Housing Bond Measure; Conservatives Say "No"

On Aug. 19, a bipartisan coalition of mayors from California's largest cities gathered at the State Capitol to urge voters to approve Proposition (Prop) 1, a \$11.25 billion housing and veterans bond measure on the November ballot.

Also known as the Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2026, Prop 1 would provide state funding for local affordable housing projects.

Sacramento Mayor Kevin McCarty said cities need the measure's support to address California's housing crisis.

"Without help from the state and this ballot measure, we can't do our jobs in cities across California. We need this measure to do our jobs," said McCarty, a former member of the California Legislative Black Caucus (CLBC).

"We need Prop 1 for the future of California, addressing the issues of this generation, and housing affordability for all levels of income throughout California," McCarty added.

The mayors said their jurisdictions lack the substantial subsidies needed to move shovel-ready affordable housing projects forward and help address the state's homelessness crisis.

The coalition included Long Beach Mayor Rex Richardson, Oakland Mayor Barbara Lee, San Diego Mayor Todd Gloria, Fresno Mayor Jerry Dyer and San Francisco Mayor Daniel Lurie.

The city leaders were joined by Sens. Bob Archuleta (D-Pico Rivera) and Christopher Cabaldon (D-West Sacramento), as well as Assemblymember Buffy Wicks (D-Oakland). Supporters say the measure would help finance the construction of 40,000 affordable housing units statewide.

"In Fresno, more than 1 of 5 residents live in poverty. That's nearly twice the state average," Dyer

said. "We need more affordable housing at every income level to include single-and multi-family dwelling units."

Prop 1 would authorize \$11.25 billion in general obligation bonds. Of that amount, \$10 billion would support affordable housing and homeownership programs and be repaid from the state's General Fund.

The measure would allocate \$7.2 billion to build, acquire or rehabilitate rental housing through low-interest loans. Another \$1.1 billion would support homeownership loan programs for low-and moderate-income households.

Prop 1 would also provide \$500 million for

housing infrastructure projects; \$450 million for farmworker housing grants and loans; \$350 million for student housing at University of California and California State University campuses; \$200 million in housing grants for Native American tribes; and \$200 million for local government pilot programs aimed at lowering housing costs.

An additional \$1.25 billion would go to the CalVet Home Loan Program to help military veterans purchase homes. Those bonds would be repaid over time through veterans' monthly mortgage payments, with the General Fund serving as a backstop.

Lee said the measure would provide critical statewide funding to complete much-needed affordable housing and permanent housing for

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Aretha Franklin's Sons Still Fighting Over Her Estate 8 Years After Her Death

DETROIT, MI. — Eight years after Aretha Franklin's death, her estate remains tied up in probate court as her sons continue to dispute assets, music rights, and personal belongings. The case has generated more than 1,400 court filings and remains unresolved. The legal battle began after Franklin died on Aug. 16, 2018, without a traditional formal will that clearly settled her estate. Her niece, Sabrina Owens, initially served as executor and discovered three handwritten documents that appeared to outline different versions of Franklin's final wishes. The conflicting papers changed what had initially looked like a straightforward inheritance process.

The biggest question centered on a handwritten 2014 document found between couch cushions at Franklin's Detroit-area home. In 2023, a Michigan jury ruled that the document was a valid will. Oakland County Probate Judge Jennifer Callaghan later interpreted it and determined how Franklin's assets should be divided among her four sons, Edward, Clarence, Kecal, and Ted White II, who performs as Teddy Richards. Despite those rulings, the estate remains open.

According to the Detroit Free Press, Kecal and White continue to disagree over several parts of their mother's estate. Their disputes include funding for Clarence, who has special needs and remains under guardianship, as well as copyright shares from songs such as "Dr. Feelgood" and "Think." They are also dealing with hundreds of personal belongings kept in 11 storage units around metro Detroit, including a vintage Ford Thunderbird and a Mercedes-Benz. White has also challenged Kecal's alleged installation of security cameras at the storage facilities.

The estate's music and video archives have become another major issue. Dozens of reel-to-reel tapes and video recordings remain in storage, with some boxes carrying little or no labeling. The material could include unreleased recordings, studio mixes, and footage from Franklin's career, including her 1998 "VH1 Divas" performance and a 2003 concert at Freedom Hill Amphitheatre. White has questioned the storage conditions and wants the recordings moved. The judge is also considering whether to appoint Nashville audio restoration specialist Catherine Vericolti to examine the tapes.

The estate once moved more smoothly under Owens, with projects such as the Jennifer Hudson film "Respect," the "Genius" miniseries starring Cynthia Erivo and the "Amazing Grace" documentary moving forward. Owens resigned in 2020 as family tensions grew over the handwritten wills. The probate case has now lasted longer than Prince's estate fight, which took about six years, although it remains shorter than the 15-year battle involving James Brown's family. A hearing over disputed legal fees was scheduled for Aug. 20, while Franklin's estate remains open until the remaining disputes are settled and her assets, music rights, and royalties are fully distributed.

\$1 Billion Lawsuit Dismissed Over Death of Black Teen Killed in School Gym

VALDOSTA, GA — The family of Kendrick Johnson, who died in a high school gym in Valdosta, Georgia, back in 2013, has had their \$1 billion lawsuit against law enforcement and local agencies dismissed. The case raised long-standing questions about how Kendrick died and whether authorities mishandled the investigation.

Kendrick was 17 when he was found dead inside a rolled-up gym mat at Lowndes High School. Officials ruled his death an accident, saying he suffocated while reaching for shoes inside the mat. The family, however, has long claimed foul play, accusing local authorities, including the GBI and the school district, of covering up the truth.

According to 11Alive, the lawsuit centered on key evidence, including school surveillance footage. An independent analyst said the video appeared altered, with missing clips. The judge noted the family filed their lawsuit nearly ten years after the footage became public, exceeding the two-year statute of limitations.

Other concerns focused on the initial investigation. The local coroner said law enforcement offered poor cooperation, and Kendrick's body had been moved and opened before he could examine it. A sheriff's report later suggested the mat opening was smaller than Kendrick's shoulders, supporting the accidental death ruling. Outside autopsies pointed to blunt force trauma, and recently discovered photos hinted at a possible skull fracture.

The judge dismissed the suit against four defendants, including the GBI, Lowndes County, and two media outlets. The GBI is protected by sovereign immunity, the county wasn't properly served, and the news companies succeeded on procedural grounds. The family has already filed an appeal and plans further legal action.

In a statement, Kendrick's father, Kenneth Johnson, warned others involved in the case, saying, "Anyone, regardless of who you are, what position of power and influence you may hold, if you choose to join the murder cover-up scandal of my son Kendrick, you do so at your own peril." The judge concluded that despite lingering concerns, the claims could not move forward.



Michael Jackson Would Have Turned 68. In Las Vegas, His Music Is Filling the Room Again

Las Vegas turns up the music to celebrate Michael Jackson’s birthday.

The lights go out, the theater goes dark, and then that unmistakable voice fills the room, even before the song begins. Suddenly, Michael Jackson feels larger than life once more.

His image appears above the Las Vegas stage while dancers perform moves inspired by him, acrobats spin through the air, and his decades-old music fills a theater designed for it. Now, 64 drones fly overhead, and nine new LED panels light up the room with images.

Jackson died 17 years ago. He would have turned 68 on August 29. At Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino, the Estate of Michael Jackson and Cirque du Soleil are planning a birthday celebration at a special time: Michael Jackson is having another big year.

The biographical film Michael, directed by Antoine Fuqua and starring Jackson’s nephew Jaafar Jackson, has made over \$1 billion worldwide. It is now the highest-grossing biopic and music biopic ever and the biggest film in Lionsgate’s history. The movie opened in late April with \$97 million in the U.S. and \$217 million worldwide, making it the largest global debut for a musical biopic.

Alana Clapp, general manager of Michael Jackson ONE, thinks the movie’s success is bringing longtime Jackson fans back with new excitement and introducing him to a new generation who never saw him perform.

“We’re seeing such a wonderful movement right now with Michael Jackson and old fans that are coming together to celebrate his legacy and his stature in pop culture,” Clapp told The Black Press. “I think a lot of that is obviously driven by the success of the biopic that’s come out recently.”

That energy is making this year’s birthday celebration feel different.

“We’re lucky enough in Las Vegas to have a show that can continue to celebrate everything that he has done as a performer and as an entertainer in today’s world,” Clapp said.

A one-time birthday surprise
The Aug. 29 celebration begins at 12:30 p.m. with the sixth annual fan reception in the lobby of the Michael Jackson ONE Theater for ticketholders to either the 6:30 or 9 p.m. show.

At 2 p.m., the theater opens to everyone. A question-and-answer session with special guests chosen by Jackson’s Estate starts at 2:30 p.m., followed by a surprise that Clapp is keeping secret.

“The Q&A portion will culminate with a performance, a unique, one-time-only special performance by the cast of Michael Jackson ONE, where you will only be able to see it this one time,” she said.

“The cast and crew have worked incredibly hard on bringing something new and fun and different than anything that you’ve seen on our stages before.”

Organizers plan to live-stream the Q&A for fans worldwide. Michael Bush, Jackson’s longtime costume designer, will hold his annual book signing near the Michael Jackson ONE Boutique, followed by pre-show meet-and-greets with Estate representatives, special guests, and members of the ONE creative team.

Cupcakes will be served, too.
After all, it is Michael Jackson’s birthday.
Michael without an impersonator

The celebration centers on a show facing a clear challenge: its star can’t step onto the stage.

Cirque doesn’t try to solve this by hiring an impersonator.

For Clapp, this is key to what makes ONE special.

“This is the only show where you get to see Michael Jackson,” she said. “It’s not an impersonator or somebody who’s playing tribute to Michael. It is Michael Jackson.”

Jackson is seen through his original recordings and films, sometimes shown on a huge scale. His choreography, costumes, and images are the base, while Cirque’s dancers and acrobats perform live around him.

His voice fills the theater as performers move above the audience. Dancers strike poses that fans instantly recognize. Sometimes, the acrobatics fade, and Jackson’s image takes over, making it feel like a



concert—until you remember he’s been gone since 2009.

Michael Jackson ONE just marked its 13th anniversary and, as Clapp describes, has had a “massive refresh” with new music, costumes, and technology. A striking addition may be flying above the seats: 64 drones will move above the crowd.

“This is one of the first times that’s being done in an indoor space,” Clapp said, “and we’re really proud of that.”

Nine new LED panels add even more visuals, and a new Diabolo act set to “Wanna Be Startin’ Somethin’” has performers tossing spinning objects high into the air as Jackson’s 1983 hit plays.

Clapp thinks Jackson, who always pushed the limits of concert technology and showmanship, would like these updates.

“I would hope that he would be very proud of what the team has done,” she said. “Especially with the refresh, bringing some of these new technological elements.”

A new generation finds Michael

You can sometimes see the renewed excitement for Jackson even before the show starts.

More fans are showing up in Jackson-inspired outfits. Military jackets, black leather, buckles, glitter, and fedoras fill the lobby, creating a living timeline of his career, where his style is almost as famous as his music.

Some remember when those looks were new.

Others weren’t alive to see them.

Michael’s billion-dollar movie has opened a new door for younger fans. They can see Jaafar Jackson play his uncle, then look back and discover Motown 25, the moonwalk, Thriller, “Billie Jean,” Bad, “Smooth Criminal,” and concert clips of Jackson standing still while crowds went wild.

Then, they can visit Las Vegas, where the actor steps aside.

Jackson’s real voice and images are still there, with Cirque performers bringing his recordings to life on stage.

That mix of generations will be clear on August 29, when fans who remember the Jackson 5 sit

alongside people whose first real experience with Michael Jackson was the 2026 movie.

By the end of the night, the special guests will have taken the stage, Bush will have signed books, the unique performance will be over, and most of the cupcakes will be gone.

Then the doors will close.

The dancers and acrobats will get ready. Nine LED panels will sit in the dark. Sixty-four drones will wait to take off.

No one knows how Michael Jackson would have sounded at 68, or what he might have done with today’s technology.

Las Vegas can’t answer that question.

But it can dim the lights and let his original voice fill the room.

“That is what makes this show so unique and unlike anything else in the world,” Clapp said. “Seeing it live with the human performance element and with Michael himself is an experience that you will never forget.”

Insurance Redlining Means Two Identical Drivers Pay Different Prices

Insurance redlining happens when the address on your policy shapes your rate more than your record behind the wheel. Companies build prices from personal details like your neighborhood and credit, not just your driving history. The result: two drivers with identical records can pay far different premiums, and the steeper bill usually falls on Black neighborhoods.

State regulators are starting to back up what drivers have suspected for years. A 2024 study by the D.C. Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking found that Black drivers pay 46% more than white drivers on average — \$1,031 a year compared to \$705. Even after researchers accounted for age, claims history, and driving records, this gap persisted.

Gaps this large are no coincidence. They come from pricing formulas that lean on credit scores, homeownership, and neighborhood lines shaped by decades of housing discrimination. The old red ink is gone from the maps, yet its outline still lives in the algorithms that set your premium.

What Is Redlining in Insurance?

In the 1930s, federal housing maps drew red lines around Black neighborhoods and branded them "hazardous." This is what insurance redlining is. For decades, insurers and banks used these maps to deny coverage and loans. This practice was outlawed by the Fair Housing Act of 1968.

Modern insurance redlining wears a different disguise. An agent will be happy to sell you coverage regardless of race. By the time the quote reaches you, the higher price looks like just another number.

These models measure where you live and what you own, not how well you drive. Advocates say the pricing pattern lands almost exactly where the old red lines sat. Even with a flawless record, a driver in a majority-Black area often pays hundreds more than a twin driver a few miles away.

Why Do Auto Insurance Premiums Vary by ZIP Code?

Insurance companies frame ZIP-based pricing as basic risk math. More crashes, more theft, and pricier repairs in an area should mean higher rates, they say. The explanation sounds fair until you look at how narrowly the map gets sliced.

ZIP codes are only one piece of the formula. Insurers also rely on non-driving rating factors, including:

- Credit history
- Education level
- Occupation
- Marital status
- Homeownership

Each of these inputs sits entirely outside driving skill, and each can still shift auto insurance premiums by hundreds of dollars a year.

The same pattern shows up outside auto coverage. The Consumer Federation of America documented a racial premium gap in home insurance as well, with predominantly Black neighborhoods paying roughly 16% more, about \$500 extra each year, for the same coverage.

What Are Regulators Doing About Insurance Redlining?

State watchdogs are finally looking inside the pricing machinery. Colorado has moved first, with a rule that requires insurers to hunt down bias in their own models and correct it.

Under the state's expanded regulation, which took effect in October 2025, auto insurers that use outside consumer data must prove their tools avoid unfair discrimination in insurance practices. The requirements are direct:

- Test pricing models for racial bias
- Report the results to state officials
- Fix any model that fails

This makes Colorado the first state to require measurable evidence of fair pricing from auto insurers rather than taking their word for it.

What Can Drivers Do About High Rates and

Most states let insurers use credit-based insurance scores, and a weak score can raise your premium more than a speeding ticket does. California, Hawaii, and Massachusetts ban the practice for auto policies entirely. Improving your credit can lower your rate everywhere else, often within one or two renewal cycles.

Can I Find Out Why My Rate Went Up?

Federal law requires an adverse action notice whenever your credit information raises your rate or limits your coverage. You can also ask your agent in writing for the specific reasons behind any increase. The answer may reveal a factor you can change before the next renewal.

How Do I File a Complaint About Unfair Insurance Pricing?

Every state insurance department accepts consumer complaints online at no cost. Include your policy number, the quotes you received, and any letters from the insurer. Regulators track complaint patterns, so each filing helps build the case for stricter rules.

Can Usage-Based Insurance Lower My Premium?

Usage-based programs track real habits through an app or plug-in device, then price the policy on braking, speed, and mileage. Safe drivers in high-priced ZIP codes often save 10% to 30% this way. Read the terms first, since some programs can raise rates for risky driving.

Fair Prices Should Follow the Driver, Not the Map

Insurance redlining works best when nobody notices it. It lives inside an algorithm, a credit check, or a boundary drawn decades ago, and it leaves careful drivers in Black neighborhoods paying more for identical protection.

“Passing a Law Isn’t The Finish Line”: California Assembly Evaluates Implementation, Results

California lawmakers are finding that laws passed in Sacramento do not always work as intended once implemented. A new [Assembly oversight program](#) has identified gaps in laws addressing wildfire recovery, insurance, foster care and clean energy.

Assembly Speaker Robert Rivas (D-Hollister) announced Aug. 17 that the Assembly had completed the first year of its Outcomes Review program. Billed as the first initiative of its kind in the nation, the program enlisted 15 Assembly members to evaluate 14 laws they authored or championed. Through public hearings and community meetings, lawmakers assessed whether the measures were producing their intended results.

“Passing a law isn’t the finish line,” said Rivas. “The Outcomes Review project makes sure we’re checking our work.”

The reviews identified both successes and shortcomings. The expansion of telehealth largely improved access to care and provided patients with greater flexibility. Affordable housing financing reforms also strengthened coordination among state agencies and could reduce duplicative paperwork, development costs and delays.

Other reviews uncovered more significant implementation problems.

One focused on [Assembly Bill \(AB\) 238](#), which was enacted after the Eaton and Palisades fires to provide eligible borrowers with up to 12 months of emergency mortgage forbearance. The review found lender noncompliance, insufficient consumer complaint data and a need for stronger coordination between state and federal agencies.

Those findings helped shape AB 1842 and AB 1847, both victim-protection bills that are currently pending in the Senate.

After discovering that California’s [FAIR Plan](#) clearinghouse was failing to transition affected homeowners back into the private insurance market, Assemblymember Lisa Calderon (D-Whittier) introduced AB 69 to fix the issue.

A separate review found that the California Public Utilities Commission’s implementation of AB 2316 had not fulfilled the law’s intent or produced new community solar projects. In response, Assemblymember Chris Ward (D-San Diego) introduced AB 1813, legislation to overhaul the state’s renewable energy program and increase access to solar technology.

Lawmakers also found that the FAIR Plan clearinghouse was not effectively helping homeowners move into the traditional insurance market, prompting the introduction of AB 69, legislation adding new reporting, notification, and access requirements.

The program identified additional implementation problems related to foster care placement protections, oversight of charitable fundraising and wage theft enforcement.

Rivas said the findings demonstrate the need for lawmakers to continue evaluating legislation after it takes effect.

“This isn’t oversight for its own sake — it’s what accountability looks like, and we’re just getting started,” he said.

The Assembly plans to expand the Outcomes Review program in 2027 by involving more lawmakers and holding additional public hearings and community meetings. The next phase, according to Rivas, will build on the pilot year as lawmakers seek to identify implementation problems earlier and improve how state laws work in practice.

Gov. Newsom’s Latest Appointees Include Sacramento Advocate for Formerly Incarcerated Students; State’s New Tech Chief

Gov. Gavin Newsom announced eight appointments Aug. 19, including a new state chief technology officer and the reappointment of a Sacramento State outreach coordinator who works with formerly incarcerated students.

Ayushi Roy, of San Francisco, was appointed state chief technology officer at the California Department of Technology. Roy has taught at Harvard Kennedy School since 2022 and previously held technology and policy roles with New America, the U.S. General Services Administration, and the U.S. Office of Management and Budget.

Roy’s policy work has focused on the gap between government programs and the people they are intended to serve. In a Harvard course inspired by Beyoncé’s “Cowboy Carter,” she teaches students to examine how administrative and implementation barriers can undermine social safety-net programs.

“I do know as a practitioner, having served

in the government for over a dozen years, that the building of technology is the easy part; managing the political feasibility and the implementation is the hard part,” Roy said.

Roy’s appointment requires Senate confirmation and carries compensation of \$214,692.

Newsom also reappointed Michael Love, of Sacramento, to the State Rehabilitation Council, where he has served since 2025. Love has been an outreach coordinator at California State University, Sacramento since 2024 and previously held several roles at the university, including administrative services coordinator for Project Rebound and teacher’s associate.

Project Rebound supports formerly incarcerated students as they pursue higher education, making Love’s appointment relevant to the council’s work involving vocational rehabilitation services.

Love earned bachelor’s and master’s degrees in communication studies from Sacramento State. He is a Democrat.

Newsom also appointed Eric De La Cruz of Sacramento as executive director of the Racial Equity Commission. De La Cruz has served as chief of the Office of Civil Rights at the Department of Toxic Substances Control since 2022. The position pays \$146,220 and does not require Senate confirmation.

The governor additionally appointed Christine Aurigemma to the State Rehabilitation Council and reappointed Lisa Weiler, Michelle Bello and Matthew Asner. The council positions are unpaid and do not require Senate confirmation.

Gov. Newsom Launches New Free Lunch Program; Announces Nearly \$14,000 Per Family in Universal TK Savings

Gov. Gavin Newsom marked the start of California’s new school year by [highlighting universal](#) free school meals and the statewide expansion of Transitional Kindergarten, which the state says saves families nearly \$14,000 per child each year.

Newsom and First Partner Jennifer Siebel Newsom celebrated the full implementation of Universal Transitional Kindergarten, making free TK available to every 4-year-old in California. The state enrolled 213,313 children in TK during the 2024-25 school year and has invested \$12.5 billion in the program since 2019.

“California is proving what’s possible with historic investments in the next generation,” said Newsom. “Free TK for every 4-year-old. Free meals at school. Expanded after school programs.”

California is also providing two free school meals each day to every public-school student, regardless of family income. The state has served nearly 3.5 billion free meals through its Universal Meals Program, with 2.9 million students connected to California-grown, nutritious food.

The administration says the school investments extend beyond meals and early education. California has committed \$4.7 billion to its Master Plan for Kids’ Mental Health, placed more than 4,000 trained professionals in schools and community organizations, and provided free mental health services to more than 500,000 children, youth and families.

The state is also expanding literacy programs, with more than 800 high-need elementary schools receiving support from literacy coaches and reading specialists. Special education funding has increased by \$2.4 billion, or 43%.

The investments come as California reports academic gains across every tested subject and grade level, with particularly strong gains among Black and Latino students and continued improvement among socioeconomically disadvantaged students.

Newsom said the broader effort is aimed at ensuring students have the support they need before, during and after the school day.

“Every parent wants their child to feel safe, supported, nourished, and inspired when they walk through the school doors,” said Siebel Newsom. “California recognizes that if we want to give our kids the best start in life, we need to invest in the whole child.”

On Aug. 21, Gov. Gavin Newsom and First Partner Jennifer Siebel Newsom announced that families have claimed 1 million accounts through [CalKIDS](#), California’s publicly funded college and career savings program. Launched in 2022, CalKIDS has established more than 6 million accounts containing over \$2.3 billion in savings, with eligible students receiving up to \$1,500 for higher education or career training. The Newsoms also unveiled the California Golden Start Challenge, a public-private partnership aimed at encouraging businesses and philanthropic organizations to contribute additional money to children’s savings accounts.

Gubernatorial Candidate Steve Hilton Blasts California’s New Tire Rules

Republican gubernatorial candidate Steve Hilton [is criticizing](#) California’s new replacement-tire efficiency standards, arguing they will limit consumer choice and increase costs for drivers.

Gov. Gavin Newsom, however, says the regulations will save consumers money.

Hilton protested [the standards](#) Aug. 20 outside the California Energy Commission in Sacramento, where he and supporters chanted, “Hands off our tires.” The commission unanimously approved the regulations Aug. 17, making California the first state to adopt energy-efficiency standards for replacement tires.

“We are done with these bureaucrats and these politicians in our state, making everything so insanely expensive,” Hilton said at the protest.

Hilton said that, if elected governor, he would eliminate or defund the Energy Commission. His opposition to the tire standards is part of his broader criticism of California’s high cost of living.

Newsom defended the regulations Aug. 19, citing the commission’s projected savings for consumers.

“I think it was a good choice,” said Newsom. “Save a billion dollars a year in fuel. Talk about an affordability agenda, that makes sense to me.”

The [Replacement Tire Efficiency Program](#) sets limits on rolling resistance, which measures how much energy a tire requires to move along a road. Tires with lower rolling resistance can improve a gasoline-powered vehicle’s fuel economy or extend

an electric vehicle’s driving range.

The first phase will take effect in 2029, setting a maximum rolling resistance of 9.1 newtons per kilonewton. A stricter limit of 7.2 newtons per kilonewton will take effect in 2033.

The Energy Commission says the standards will ensure that replacement tires are, on average, at least as energy efficient as those installed on new vehicles. The agency estimates the regulations will save Californians nearly \$1 billion annually in gasoline and electricity costs while reducing carbon dioxide emissions by two million metric tons a year.

Some tire manufacturers, however, have raised concerns about the effect on prices and product availability. Goodyear estimates that about 70% of replacement tires currently sold in California would not meet the 2033 standard and argues that the regulations could increase costs for consumers.

The Energy Commission estimates the standards will add about \$1.50 to the cost of each tire during the first phase and \$6.50 per tire beginning in 2033. The commission projects that a driver with a gasoline-powered vehicle could save about \$179 in fuel costs over the life of a set of tires meeting the 2033 standard.

The regulations exempt several specialty products, including competition, winter, used, retreaded, motorcycle and certain off-road tires.

Bakersfield's Nigerian Community Eyes a Role in Growing California-Nigeria Ties

The relationship between California and Nigeria took center stage at the United Nigeria Diaspora Foundation's (UNDF) 2026 annual dinner, where community leaders, elected officials and a senior California state official explored how the Nigerian diaspora could help deepen economic, cultural and diplomatic ties between the two countries.

Held under the theme "Partnering for Prosperity: Deepening the U.S.-Nigeria Strategic Alliance," the gathering brought together Nigerian-American community leaders and public officials, including California Transportation Secretary Toks Omishakin, Georgia State Rep. Segun Adeyina and Bakersfield Mayor Karen Goh.

The conversation went beyond celebrating the Nigerian community's contributions in the United States to harnessing the diaspora as a bridge for investment, technology, workforce development, agriculture, healthcare and cultural exchange between Nigeria and the United States.

Omishakin, whose portfolio includes transportation and infrastructure, highlighted areas where California and Nigeria could learn from each other.

California, he said, has expertise in infrastructure, technology, artificial intelligence, agriculture and clean energy that could offer lessons for Nigeria. But he stressed that the relationship should not be viewed as one in which California simply teaches Nigeria.

"There are so many things that we can learn from one another," Omishakin said. "Vice versa, not a one-way aspect of this relationship."

He pointed to developments across Africa, including Nigeria's technology and entertainment industries, as examples of areas where California could also learn from the continent.

With Nigeria's median age significantly lower than that of the United States, Omishakin also highlighted Nigeria's large and youthful population as both an opportunity and a challenge.

"The challenge that's in front of Nigeria is making sure that as these young people graduate, there's employment opportunity for them," he said.

Energy was another area he identified as a significant potential for cooperation. He said that California is experienced in renewable energy and that Nigeria could capitalize on its abundant solar, wind, hydropower, and other resources to diversify its energy system.

Omishakin also outlined steps California has taken to strengthen its relationship with Africa, including the California Africa Climate and Economic Forum, which brings together African government and business leaders with California officials to discuss trade, economic development, and climate issues.

For Bakersfield, the discussion carries a potentially local economic dimension.

Adeyina, who represents Georgia in the state legislature, specifically pointed to agriculture as an area where California and Nigeria could find common ground.

"I know Bakersfield is very big on agriculture," he said, identifying the region's agricultural strength as a potential avenue for trade and cooperation.

Bakersfield's Nigerian community is moving to act on the momentum of that partnership. Dr. Joseph Ohens, president of the Nigerian American Association of Bakersfield, said the group is encouraging its members to attend the California-Lagos Business & Investment Summit on Sept. 17 in Sacramento and hopes to be a major player in this strategic alliance.

"The Nigerian diaspora here in Bakersfield can help turn that relationship into practical economic opportunities through the skills, businesses and expertise we already contribute to California," Ohens said.

UNDF president Francis Uwagie-Ero said the Nigerian-American diaspora can and should serve as a bridge between Nigeria and the communities where we live and work.

"I believe the Nigerian diaspora should be viewed not simply as a bridge between two countries, but as an important economic and intellectual asset in the relationship between them."

Bakersfield Mayor Goh said she felt the "palpable determination" of Bakersfield's Nigerian community to create opportunities and mentor young Nigerians to contribute to community development in both the United States and Nigeria.

"Thank you to UNDF for building bridges, empowering communities, and creating opportunities," Goh said.

The UNDF dinner offered a reminder that the Nigerian contribution to healthcare is not limited to providing care— it also includes research and innovation.

Among those honored was Dr. Sota Omoigui, a researcher and pain medicine specialist based in Los Angeles whose work includes research into sickle cell disease and pain management. He described his recent discovery as an effort to identify interventions that could help prevent sickle-cell crises from becoming life-threatening emergencies.

He has called the early intervention period the "Golden Half Hour" – the first half hour of a crisis, arguing that timely access to oxygen at home could help prevent a crisis from progressing and avert hospitalization. For him, the stakes extend beyond medicine.

"Every time a child or a person uses home oxygen and prevents a crisis, we are saving a family," he said.

The evening also honored Smith Efada, a longtime California resident whose decades in Bakersfield have given him a front-row view of the growth and evolution of the Nigerian community. His almost 40-year perspective shows how dramatically the community has diversified.

"The Nigerian community has evolved; today we contribute immensely to healthcare provision for the county," Efada said.

For Omishakin, another sector of exchange is already visible globally through Nigeria's entertainment industry. He cited the international growth of Afrobeats and Nollywood as examples of Nigerian influence reaching far beyond the country's borders.

For the United Nigeria Diaspora Foundation, the challenge now is turning the conversations at this dinner into measurable partnerships.
